CAPHN continues to communicate with community partners. April 29, 2009 CAPHN sought alternative sites for NEHC’s and has a preliminary list of 3 so far. A staffing notice went out to all members. A meeting was held to discuss the MRC. CAPHN is still fielding calls from the local municipalities and referrals to the CAPHN website with written information sent out by the state in addition to links for the CDC and WHO.

Overview of Requests for Assistance Made to AHHR

A town asked CAPHN what the State would do to help them explain what will be available to their residents in the event of a NH outbreak. Discussion ensued that a press release of some kind which would outline the present NH Public Health Networks and the framework that exists. They feel this will help them explain that there is a plan and that there will be resources to treat the community. This may help people know when and if the time comes where to go and that staying out of healthcare facilities will e paramount.

Telephone call from Dr. Bassi of St. Paul’s school-just checking in. They are monitoring students who have traveled (none to Mexico, just southern California and Texas). They are communicating with the area private schools. They will stay in touch and call if they have any questions or requests.

Operational Objectives for last Shift (what specific tasks and priorities did you set for the AHHR)

CAPHN worked on the NEHC contacts, inventorying of resources in the community as well as the CAPHN assets. A preliminary discussion regarding how we would distribute our supplies (admin and set up supplies). Have contacted regional fire departments for availability for fit testing masks if needed.

Operational Objectives for next 12-, 24 and 36-hours (what specific tasks and priorities do you have for the AHHR)

CAPHN will continue to seek alternative NEHC sites and brief the MACE staff on protocol. A MRC recruiting meeting was set up for April 30, 2009 at the NH Police Standards and Training facility 6 PM to 8 PM, which we will still hold.

We will be compiling our list of available volunteers.

Will review the new MEMS document for further information.

Will communicate with membership and update them on CAPHN activities.

Will continue to set up preliminary plan to fit test staff for masks if needed.

CAPHN will review the MRC directive and act accordingly
