Once the notification that Concord Hospital had "probable swine flu cases" the decision to activate the regional MACE. At 3:00 PM April 30, 2009 the Capital Area Public Health Network (CAPHN) activated it's MACE and began full operation at 4:30 Pm located at the Merrimack County Sheriff's Office (163 North Main Street, Concord, NH 03301). The MACE will remain open and fully staffed according to the NH DPHS ICC hours of operation. The CAPHN MACE has received several requests for PPE from the locals as well as Concord Hospital.

### **Overview of Requests for Assistance Made to AHHR**

1806 hours- April 30, 2009 the CAPHN MACE received a request from Concord Fire Department for 200 N-95 masks to be delivered to Central Fire Station.

1950 hours-April 30, 2009 the Concord Hospital requested 5000 surgical masks, 1000 large N-95 masks, 750 medium N-95 masks, 250 small N-95.

May 1, 2009- Loudon Fire Department 300 large N-95, 120 medium, 60 small N-95. 1000 surgical.

The MACE requested a printer and 2 boxes of copy paper.
